

General Discussion – Cross Cutting Themes Quintin Harper, Co-Chair



Cross-cutting Themes

- I see commercial, I see affordable housing, neighborhood that has existing for generations, J bus, road diet has made cycling and walking a part of the community | affordable housing, economic sustainability, climate, transportation, parks, recreation & culture
- 2. Potential of Greene Tract to be inclusive of cross-cutting themes
- 3. Affordable housing, different streetscape, kids safe bikes to school, buses, minus the red light; I would like to see more workforce & affordable housing two different things (workforce housing is not being built now 900-1,500 sq. ft. starter homes, size limited housing is not affordable for most elderly, families starting, Town should use lots that it has and acquire lots for affordability; affordability means diff. things to diff. people (less than 30% AMI standard equation doesn't work)
- 4. Opportunity to surround ourselves that looks good, feels that we are proud of, enables aff. Housing, transp. Econ. Sustainability, rec.; businesses want to open up, can sustain a community, plan needs more focus that our community can look better, e.g. Weaver St. Market, beautiful and sustainable environ.
- We need a place that looks good and is safe; things that bind us together, pride in the community

Cross-cutting Themes

- 5. Weaver St. Market what it looks to leave their front doorstep, hop on a bus, can hang out on the lawn of Weaver St. Market, these places, streetscapes accessible
- 6. There's a lot around racial equity, Black and Brown businesses, but concerned of strategies, spreading ourselves thin, Black people who are doing a lot of heavy lifting, proposing to hire a Black or Brown person specifically as a paid position, don't want to burn out the person who do have access
- 7. Come to our communities in holistic ways, mobile home parks that they can stay, accessible to downtown, bus transportation not a one-off
- 8. Equitable and affordable communities, where our folks can live here, stay here, from people making lowest wages to people making 6 figures and above
- 9. Draft most all of the issues cross, affordable housing, econ. Sustainability, transportation Econ. Sustainability needs to be jobs that pay so you can afford to be here, cost of living is higher here than rest of state, yet income gap, we have a problem, policies that can be changed that cut across so that people have a fair wage, transportation free buses, alternatives impacts low wealth and BIPOC communities, **WE NEED TO DO SOMETHING!**, I need some I gotta do it language, need to be compelled, committed, safety issue in regard to recreation and parks, call boxes, action oriented
