

Climate Action & Environment

- Achieve 80% reduction in per capita
 GHG below 2010 levels by 2030
- Enable lower-income residents and small businesses to participate and benefit from climate resiliency programs
- Conserve and restore watersheds, ecosystems and native species
- Promote policies to ensure equitable distribution of environmental burdens and access to natural areas





Climate Action & Environment



Increase all residents' access to and use of renewable energy sources



Develop programs to help residents prepare for climate change and reduce greenhouse gas emissions



Improve ecosystems, watersheds, climate resiliency, and residential life via stormwater management measures



CHAPTER FOUR

Examine Carrboro's soil and explore improvements to support greenhouse gas capture



Provide technical assistance to Town staff, business, owners, and residents on how to grow native plants and preserve trees

Transportation & Infrastructure

- Address disparate impacts of transportation and investments in BIPOC, lower-income and non-abled populations.
- Expand multi-modal transportation that prioritizes walking, biking and transit
- Reduce GHG from motor vehicle use by 80%
- Maintain and improve quality of water supply
- Reduce treated water use while improving affordability
- Expand stormwater green infrastructure



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Transportation, Green Infrastructure, Energy, and Water

Transportation



Improve transit schedules for people who work outside of traditional hours, and include transit signs in multiple languages.



Create and design safe streets and trail networks for pedestrians, students, bike riders, and transit riders, and encourage people to drive safely.



Green Infrastructure



Improve tree canopy along roads to reduce heat island effect and reduce stormwater runoff on streets



Coordinate transportation and public infrastructure improvements with stormwater green infrastructure



Transportation, Green Infrastructure, Energy, and Water

Energy



Create policies for energy efficient construction and retrofits, especially for buildings providing affordable housing.



Conduct energy audit of buildings and develop an Energy Dashboard to identify progress towards the Town's energy goal over time



Transportation, Green Infrastructure, Energy, and Water

Water



Research and develop pollution prevention and clean-up to improve various water ecosystems.



Partner with OWASA to support water conservation and efficiency programs that reduce costs for business owners and residents

Affordable Housing

- Increase number of affordable homeownership units
- Increase number of affordable rental units
- Diversify and expand housing options of different affordable housing types
- Maintain and improve Naturally Occurring Affordable Housing (NOAH)
- Expand resources for affordable housing

- Promote economic development that is resilient and promotes excellence in design
- Grow the arts, entertainment, cultural and tourism sectors
- Encourage transition to economy to one based on green technology and lowimpact industries





Support business opportunities and unique ownership models.




Promote the green economy including local innovators and low-impact industries.

Study the feasibility of an indoor rec center, swimming pool, and/or splash pad in Town



Support and install public artwork by local artists in strategic locations throughout Town to celebrate the history and story of Carrboro



Add outdoor exercise equipment in parks and along trails for affordable and easy access




Support the County's implementation of Twin Creeks Park



Maintain and expand opportunities in Carolina North Forest and University Lake.

Land Use

- Promote design that contributes to the character and promotes the diversity of Carrboro
- Plan for expansion of affordable housing through land use tools
- Support development patterns that advance climate action goals
- Improve access and availability of Town Parks
- Preserve architecturally significant and historic properties and districts that represent the history and diversity of the community







Promote sustainable building and development practices that preserves natural areas.



Preserve and expand affordable housing in key places that are walkable, bikeable, and accessible to transit.



Encourage thoughtful design of public spaces to highlight the culture, diversity, and history of the Town.





Identify additional park space to serve residents within a 15-minute walk.



Increase the amount of land available for commercial and mixed-use development



Work towards an improved, efficient, and transparent development approval process

COMMUNICATIONS/COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT



Mission: Recruit members from and develop public sessions with community-based organizations and resident leaders, prioritizing traditionally underrepresented populations.

Implement the Inclusive Carrboro Communications and Community Engagement Plan

Increase public awareness of and participation in Town decisions, programs and services

FINANCE



Mission: Provides financial management support for delivery of townwide services.

Develop a Participatory Budgeting process for the Town

FIRE AND RESCUE



Mission: To continuously strive to focus on our Community's needs, wants, and safety and to provide them our best possible service.

Provide community risk reduction services, including public education and fire prevention efforts

INFORMATION AND TECHNOLOGY



Mission: Assist departments in delivering technology-based solutions that are cost-effective and increase the effectiveness and efficiency of various Town services.

Provide the technology to enhance the delivery of Town services and to increase the access to and the quality of vital government data.

PLANNING



Mission: Help define and carry out the Town's vision for sustaining existing and future populations. Monitor availability and use of resources needed to maintain a balance of the built and natural environments.

To evaluate developments in new or redeveloping areas, in support of diversifying revenue streams and maintaining ethnic and economic diversity.

To coordinate development of a well-balanced public infrastructure, including green infrastructure which improves walkability and access to transit.



CHAPTER NINE

Public Services & Communications

POLICE



Mission: Protects citizens, businesses and properties by providing committed law enforcement officers and community services that foster a safe living environment.

Develop and retain personnel who effectively deal with emergency, crisis, and/or complex situations.

Increase Community Policing efforts.

PUBLIC WORKS



Mission: Promote a safe, healthy, and pleasing environment and community through ever progressing projects, programs, and services

Maintain public buildings and grounds in an environmentally friendly manner so they are pleasant and safe gathering spaces.

Provide timely, cost effective maintenance of public street system including signage, storm drainage system, multi-use paths, and right-of-way.

TOWN CLERK



Mission: Prepares Town Council agendas and minutes and make them available; maintain official town documents; prepare and make updates to the Town Code and provide support for the Mayor and Council

Provide multiple public access points for all minutes and agendas.

TOWN MANAGER



Mission: Implement the policies of the Mayor and Town Council and communicate them to the citizenry.

To give well-informed, helpful advice to the Council Members on policy options and other matters.

To lead an organization that functions well internally and implements Council policies in a timely, effective, efficient, and friendly manner.

MUNICIPAL OPERATIONS



Increase the energy efficiency of municipal buildings and reduce greenhouse gas emissions from municipal fleet operations.
